AFFIRMATION OF ROSCOE "ROCKY" B. MARSHALL, JR.

- I, ROSCOE "ROCKY" B. MARSHALL, JR., make this affirmation under penalty of perjury pursuant to CPLR § 2106 and declare the following to be true:
- 1. I am familiar with the facts and circumstances set forth in this Affirmation, which are based upon my personal knowledge.
- 2. I am a resident of the State of Texas, am over the age of eighteen years, have never been convicted of a felony, and am fully competent to make this Affirmation and otherwise give testimony in the courts of New York.
- 3. I currently serve on the Board of Directors of the National Rifle Association of America. As a current NRA Director, I attended the NRA Board of Directors meeting held on September 7, 2024 at the Omni Las Colinas Hotel, 221 East Las Colinas Boulevard, Dallas (Irving), Texas 75039.
- 4. During the September 7, 2024 meeting of the NRA Board of Directors, the Board considered dissolving the Special Litigation Committee (SLC). This committee was previously

created by the Board, and had been granted authority to manage certain litigation in which NRA executives had conflicts of interest. The NRA Executives that had a conflict of interest when the SLC was created was Wayne LaPierre and John Frazer. The current members of the SLC are Charles Cotton, Bob Barr, and David Coy.

- 5. A roll call vote was taken on the following motion: "*To rescind the SLC*." A roll call vote was called from the floor so that the vote would be made public and printed in the NRA American Rifleman Magazine.
- 6. It is my understanding that, under Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised (12th edition) Section 35, paragraph 35:2(7) (which governs procedures at NRA Board meetings under NRA Bylaws Article XIV, Section 2(a)), a motion to rescind a previous action, without prior notice of the motion, requires an affirmative vote that *either* is a majority of the entire voting membership of the 76-member Board, which is 39, *or* is two thirds of the votes cast.
- 7. As published below, there were 60 votes cast, with 34 in the affirmative to rescind the Special Litigation Committee and 26 in the negative against rescinding it. Because previous notice of the motion had not been given and the number of votes in the affirmative was both less than 39 and less than two-thirds of the vote cast, the motion was defeated.
